- 1. Identify crops grown in your location, region or around the state. Write your answers in your notebook or on a whiteboard.
- 2. Share answers with the class.
- 3. Where are these crops located? Write your answers in your notebook or on a whiteboard.
- 4. Open Google Maps to view your local area. Zoom in and select the satellite view.
- 5. How do areas that are farmed look different from their neighborhood?
- 6. Identify the crop(s) growing there.
- 7. Play two truths and a lie about Ohio agriculture.
- 8. Make up your own 2 truths and a lie using info from this website: https://www.ohiosos.gov/profile-ohio/things/ohio-agriculture/
- 9. What crops are grown in Ohio?
- 10. Take some time to look up and answer the following questions:
  - a. How important is soybean farming in Ohio?
  - b. What are soybeans used for? Do we eat them?
  - c. How are soybeans grown?
  - d. How are soybeans harvested?
